




Absurd Bird Bath

Absurd Bird and London interior design studio, Shed, have united to create the latest absurd restaurant within Bath's central shopping district.

The Absurd Bird brand reflects a sincere passion for the soul-warming comfort food and culinary traditions of the American south, but with a dose of fun and irony thrown in – a combination that is ever-present within the restaurant's interior.

Upon arrival, guests are greeted by a vibrant façade clad with a plethora of playful patterns,



past which lies a dark, de-saturated envelope referencing the sinister silhouettes and menacing forms of Southern Gothic cinema.

The vibrantly-coloured central bar, meanwhile, sits within the looming shadows of the clad mezzanine. Awash with bright pink and turquoise tones, the bar is topped with a garishly-clad over-bar layered with crude patterns and colourful bead 'throws'.

Surrounding the over bar is the sinister mezzanine, its artificial cladding depicting the wrought iron balconies of New Orleans. A large



sharing table on the mezzanine level anchors the various whimsical light fittings, with melancholy portraits adorning the walls.

Illustrated birds, scattered throughout the nooks and crannies of the restaurant, as well as the Southern phrase "Everybody's normal... until you get to know them" adorning the bar, bring a touch of humour to the otherwise moody space.
